You can comment on stories or send private messages for any information I may need for the school day. I will aim to look at Dojo at the beginning and end of the school day. Our Curriculum- C360



At Woolacombe our curriculum 360 (C360) is built upon four cornerstones: *Character, Community, Excellence and Innovation.*

Our team all believe in the school vision to 'leave no stone unturned' in the pursuit of an enriching and broad experience for all children. We are committed to helping our children develop and evolve during their time with us and beyond.

Phonics, Literacy and Reading

This term we will be doing a phase 5 Little Wandle review. Phonics catch up sessions will be used throughout the week for children who need extra support. We will also be moving onto guided reading and using texts to support our literacy learning. Our first book focus this term is Nobot - The robot with no bottom! We will use this book to focus on our grammar, writing composition and reading comprehension.

Little and often is key to promote a love of reading. Please continue to read with your child at least **5 times per week.** We will be checking this regularly which means bookbags will need to be in every day. Your child will have a reading for pleasure book and a book matched to their reading ability. We will be changing the books on Mondays starting from the 11th of September. If your child completed the **Summer Reading Challenge** please let me know on Dojo and send me a picture with them and their certificate. We would love to celebrate this in school.

Maths

We will use White Rose Maths for our daily sessions. Our first block of learning will be focussed on place value and we will start by consolidating numbers to 20, moving onto writing numbers to 100 in expanding form and ending with counting in 3s. There are other small steps between these and we will use NCETM for fluency. This also gives us an opportunity to consolidate any previous learning.

PE and Swimming

PE will be on Tuesday mornings. Please ensure that your child wears their full kit into school on this day. A spare PE kit should also be left in school in case your child needs a change of clothes. They can get wet and muddy in the Autumn term! **PE kits must include:** a school hoodie, hat, gloves, trainers, black tracksuit trousers or leggings, a spare white shirt and socks. A plastic bag kept inside the PE bag is always useful too, for muddy trainers. When the weather gets colder, your child may also wear a plain black, white or grey base layer.

Swimming will be on **Friday afternoons**, starting on the **15th of September**. Your child can choose to wear their swimming costumes/shorts to school (costumes rolled down half way) but please remember to pack underwear. They will be able to get changed at the swimming pool if their swimwear may be uncomfortable through the school day. I will send out more information regarding swimming in the coming days.

General Information

Please continue to use 'School Money' to book your child's school dinners, or record them as a packed lunch (the cut off is Midnight the night before), book morning and after school clubs, and pay for trips and equipment. Please also enter if your child has a home school packed lunch so we don't provide a school dinner. Please contact the office if you have any more questions.

Full school uniform must be worn, including black shoes. Long hair must be tied back, no hair products please.

The Autumn term weather can be unpredictable! Whilst it is still warm, please apply sun cream to your child in the morning. You can pop a small tube of named suncream in their bag so that they can reapply at lunch time if needed. Please ensure that they each have their own Woolacombe School water bottle and a named sunhat too. Please make sure that your child has a waterproof coat in school every day.

We ask that no toys are brought to school.

School fruit will continue to be provided for year 2. If your child brings in an unhealthy snack we will ask them to bring it back home and replace it with school fruit. When having a packed

lunch we ask for no plastic bags please. We are a plastic free school so reusable, clearly named containers only.
